Waterline Square

Those who are fond of gardening will be tantalised by what the Waterline Square offers. Rafael Viñoly Architects, Richard Meier & Partners Architects, and Kohn Pedersen Fox Associates have created an iconic collection of luxury residential buildings on one of the last remaining waterfront development sites on the Upper West Side of Manhattan. The masterplan encompasses nearly five acres and will be located in Manhattan along the Hudson River from

West 59th Street to West 61st Street, where Midtown meets the Upper West Side. The *indoor gardening studio* allows residents to grow all year round flowers and seasonal vegetables. Other amenity highlights are an *indoor tennis court, soccer field,* a modern *fitness centre, a three lane lap pool,* separate *children's pool,* arts and *music studio,* and specialty *zones for children and pets.* This residence truly fits all passions for every generation.

Madison Square Park Tower

The tallest residential building between Midtown and Lower Manhattan includes properties that range from USD 2,750,000 to USD 48,000,000. Designed by the architects at Kohn Pedersen Fox, the Madison Square Park Tower is a 65-story condominium envisioned by Martin Brudnizki Design Studio, known for its work on a number of high-profile hotels and private clubs, including Annabel's Terrace in London and the Soho Beach House in Miami Beach. Eighty-three lavish residences, as well as five full floors of amenities, have access to

facilities dedicated to recreation and wellness, such as a half court basketball court and golf simulator room with a PGA Tour Classic Golf Simulator. Residents can truly nurture their mind and body, through the variety of amenities that include a library, children's playroom, fully equipped fitness centre with private yoga and training studio, drawing room with a billiards and cards room that opens out to a landscaped terrace and a beautifully appointed entertainment suite on the 54th floor, aptly titled FIFTY FOUR.
